Online Instruction Update in the High School

As we continue to help students make a seamless transition to online instruction in the event of a future school closure, we are continuing to improve our online procedures. To keep students current with Blackboard login use and procedures, teachers are posting assignments for the week each Sunday by 10:00 a.m. In posting information, teachers are listing the assignment, date due, and approximate time to complete the work. We are also working with students on how to use Google Applications (Google Apps), and we are very pleased to see the collaboration by students and teachers in working with Blackboard and Google Apps. Through this collaboration we are finding that Blackboard is helping to enhance the classroom experience.

Also, we are continuing to work with both students in teachers with opportunities in enhancing their online skills. Last week, we gave scheduled workshops in labs 100 and 102 where the tech staff gave brief demos, addressed "how to" questions and reinforced student and teacher skills through the online process. Based on parent feedback, we are now planning parent Blackboard tutorials which will take place within the next couple of weeks.

Finally, the high school is completing a 'High School Online Protocol' based on the recommendations that came from the student survey, the High School Online Instruction Committee (comprised of students, parents, teachers and administrators), the Heads of Department, and high school faculty input at faculty meetings. This protocol will be published shortly, and will be a guide for parents, students and teachers of our online instructional program in the event of a future school closure.

Thank you for your continued support as we work to improve the high school online instruction process for students.

H1N1 Update

The fall season is upon us with its change of weather and winds bringing new challenges to staying well. We continue to encourage the recommendations established by the CDC with actions to stay healthy.

- Wash hands frequently with soap and water, for 15-20 seconds or alternatively use an alcohol based hand sanitizer and rub hands together until they are dry.
- Cover your mouth /nose when you cough or sneeze.
- If you have a tissue, cough/sneeze into the tissue and immediately dispose of the tissue. Wash your hands.
- If you do not have a tissue, cough/sneeze into the curve of your arm.
- Keep your hands away from your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Stay away from those who are sick.

If you do become ill with a sore throat and run a fever, stay home.

If you are sick, stay home until you have been symptom-free for 24hours (without the use of any fever reducing medicine),

A reminder of our protocol at CAC: If your child has an elevated temperature (above 99 degrees Fahrenheit or 37.2 degrees Celsius) **please keep them at home for 24 hours after they are fever free (without the use of fever reducing medicines).**

Other actions that can be taken to help you stay healthy are eating a well balanced diet, (high in Vitamin C), sleeping for 8 hours every night, exercise daily, drink plenty of fluids and have time for fun and relaxation.
