

Introduction

CAC's Teaching Fellow Program is modeled after the outstanding Fellow Programs at U.S. independent day and boarding schools. The program seeks to attract outstanding recent university graduates who are joining the teaching profession, and have also shown outstanding contributions to service, multiculturalism, athletic, and activity programs.

The fellowship is mutually beneficial for the fellow and CAC allowing CAC faculty to be exposed to the newest research and practices coming out of university and teacher training programs, while the fellow gains critical teaching experience. In addition, under the auspices of CAC DEI Initiatives, the fellowship allows a more inclusive approach to hiring teachers in their early careers.

This is a fixed-term fellowship of one school year. However, those wishing to start their teaching career at CAC after the fellowship, are eligible to request appointment into the position starting the second year. Fellows who are appointed into teaching positions in year two have demonstrated outstanding performance in the classroom, coaching, and support for CAC's Mission and Strategic Plan.

Teaching fellows receive a stipend to cover living expenses, round-trip airfare, furnished apartment, and medical coverage.

Duties and Responsibilities

The Teaching Fellowship is designed to provide on-the-job teaching experience to a recent university graduate starting in the teaching profession. Fellows develop their teaching competencies under the guidance, mentorship and close supervision of administrators, the Head of Department and department members. Fellows receive mentorship and guidance in all aspects of CAC's academic, activity, athletic, and art programs. The overall demands are high, and fellows are expected to make substant contributions to campus life outside of the teaching load.

Fellows are formally evaluated after each quarter to allow for feedback and growth.

Fellow Vacancies and Application Process

Areas open for fellowships will vary year to year depending on the current needs of the school. Typically, fellow vacancies will be posted on the CAC website during the normal yearly recruitment season. The application process will be defined on the posted vacancies for fellowships.

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
